Board Meeting UPDATE

Board meetings are a critical part of the success of Downey. Please feel free to join the board meetings on the second Monday of the month at Downey. Watch for reminders. If you are unable to attend, you can always catch up with the board meeting agenda and minutes. They are posted on the bulletin board in the hallway between the two classrooms.

At our last board meeting, the board voted to instate the following procedure for Downey: On preschool days the front door of Downey will be **unlocked** for arrival from 8:45 am - 9:20 am and **locked** during preschool from 9:20 am - 11:05 am unlocked for pick up 11:05 am - 11:45 am locked as the last family leaves.

If you need to enter the school during the locked times you can use the buzzer to the left of the doors. When you push the button it rings the phones in the building. Sheryl, the church secretary, can let you in. She is normally sitting at her desk Monday - Thursday starting at 9:00 am. She does not work on Fridays but David, the church's property manager, may be able to answer the phone somewhere in the building.

Another important part of this new procedure is making sure to follow through with locking and unlocking the door. If you are a parent participant, you may be asked to lock or unlock the door. Please ask if you don't know how to lock and unlock the door.

Teachers are responsible for opening the door at 8:45 am and locking it at 11:45. We decided that Tadpole participants will be responsible for locking the door at 9:20 once all Tadpoles have arrived and Polliwog/Frog participants will be


